On Friday, October 23rd four Corvettes and one GMC pickup (hauling NCM merchandise) met in McKinney for the drive to Sulphur Springs for the Corvette Classic on Heritage Square. 

November 11, 2015


Thousands of people lined downtown Dallas streets Wednesday to watch the annual Veterans Day parade and say thank you.



With great anticipation, six members of LSCC have been waiting for October 28th and 29th to begin the [Ron Fellows Driving School](#) at Spring Mountain in Pahrump, NV. Rick Herrick, John and Suzanna Main, and Chris and Gabe Sorrells took to the air from DFW to Las Vegas then finished off the trip with a short rental car ride. Phil Key, Dave and Anne Sandford and I made use of our new C7's and opted to see some country along the way to Pahrump.

My first night's stay was in Albuquerque. I arrived early so I headed over to the Unser Family Racing Museum to kill some time. What a bargain, 6 bucks for old farts, \$10 for the not so old. The Unser name in racing history started one generation before Al and Bobby made "Unser" a household name to race fans. It was the prior generation of relatives that got the Unser name in the race almanacs by competing in the Pikes Peak hill climb race, the second oldest car racing event in the USA. If you ever have a couple of extra hours to kill the next time you find yourself in Albuquerque, I highly recommend spending them wandering through the two buildings of the [Unser Racing Museum](#).

Phil and I met up in Flagstaff and drove on to Spring Mountain by way of the [longest existing section](#) of [Route 66](#) and a quick stop at [Hoover Dam](#). We arrived at the school about 5:00 where we met Dave and Anne at the registration desk. We collected the keys to our condos and agendas for our two day stay at the country club. The next day started with breakfast in the 8,000 sq. ft. clubhouse at 6:45 and followed by getting goodie bags. Then we were off to class for a prompt 8:00 start time. Rick Malone, the schools head instructor gave many of our classes on performance driving theory along with making sure everything ran on time.....down to the second!

Day 1; alternating classroom time with behind the wheel driving exercises; braking, shifting, steering and most important where to be looking when entering corners. Then back to the clubhouse for lunch followed by more classroom and driving time.

Day 2; we broke up into several driving groups predicated on the instructors evaluations of our driving on day one. All of day two was lead and follow track time mixed in with more technical classroom lectures. The speed on the track was only limited by your ability to precisely follow the instructors lines around the track. If you kept your lines neat and tidy, the instructor would give you plenty of room to use all the ponies under your right foot!

So in a nut shell, here's the bottom line; if you have taken delivery of a new C7 in the last 12 months or are getting serious about buying a new one, by all means plan on calling the Ron Fellows School. Speak to Darci Bolen @ 800.391.6891 and she will walk you through registering for the GM subsidized school. Take it from any of the 6 of us who attended, the instructors are "TOP NOTCH" and the pace is geared for those who don't have a clue on operating a C7 in the wet or dry, for those who think they know, but really haven't a clue, and to those who may be spending a few days each month at a track. Everyone will take away a positive learning experience from this school. This is one item that you shouldn't give a second thought about....."JUST DO IT"!

Should you be driving home from the school, I would recommend taking a little extra time on your return trip. I left right after class on the last school day and drove to Saint George Utah, about 3 hours north on I15. The next morning I drove across the south end of Zion National Park, through Kanab and Page, then took Hwy 160 to Hwy 163 through [Monument Valley](#) and back to Albuquerque. This awesome drive will give you just a taste of Mother Nature's best work. Southern Utah and northern Arizona have always been some of my [favorite travel spots](#) in the lower 48.....ENJOY.

CORVETTE FEATURED IN DORITOS COMMERCIAL COMPETITION ENTRY

When watching your favorite tv shows, movies or commercials, few vehicles garner a double-take or draw your attention quite like the Corvette. Such is the case for Michael Brown's entry in the Doritos Crash the Super Bowl commercial competition. Brown, a Lifetime Museum Member, is a filmmaker from Arlington, TX and a Corvette collector, with 14 models in his personal collection. When he heard that this year would be the 10th and final year for Doritos' Super Bowl commercial competition, he knew he had to enter.

Historically, the Doritos commercials have been quirky. "The big deal is the crunch sound," said Brown. "They provide a tool kit with graphics and recordings of the crunch. We just had to ask ourselves, 'how can we play off the loudness of the chips?'" Brown's creative juices started flowing – loud Doritos crunch – loud Corvette. "I first thought of the tagline 'Deliciously Noisy' and then started backing into my idea that way. And there had to be a twist at the end," Brown shared. "We also wanted to put as much quality into the production as possible."

Brown used one of his own Corvettes for the shoot, a 1967 Big Block 427. "We wanted a nice, quiet, tree-lined residential neighborhood to film," Brown said. "Arlington, TX where we live fits the bill. When I contacted the City Manager to inquire about filming, his question was 'what can we do to help?' The city really wants to promote Arlington as being filmmaker-friendly. We used a four-block stretch, city works blocked it off for us. It really worked out well to create an authentic backdrop."



Being driven by 'nerd' actor Shane Baker, the car was the center piece of an international commercial competition for Doritos. The winning spot will be shown during February's Super Bowl.

The competition is open to anyone, and videos can be submitted on crashthesuperbowl.doritos.com. "We shot this on Tuesday [November 3] for about 5-6 hours, it took two days to put together, uploaded it on Thursday and it took about 24 hours to go live on their website. It is open for viewing now. The views draw attention, you can rate the videos and the better videos rise in popularity to advance to the next round," said Brown.


