I hope you have read about the LSCC "Big Trip" this summer and are planning to join us caravanning to Michigan and Road America in Wisconsin. However, if the timing or length of the trip is not right for you, the NCM has some great trips you should consider. Quite a few LSCC members have participated in the NCM Museum in Motion (MiM) events over the years. Following are this year's offerings.

Dragon Run and Biltmore Estate (May 1 – 4)

Tail of the Dragon and Biltmore combined into one great MiM tour. From the Museum in Bowling Green, you will head east to run famous TN-129, the Tail of the Dragon. From there, it is on to Asheville, NC, with accommodations at the Biltmore Inn on the Biltmore Estate grounds.

The next day is packed, beginning with a specially arranged photo op of the Corvettes in front of the manor house followed by breakfast in the Biltmore Stable Café. A choice of tours, lunch and a private tour of the mansion complete the day. Your final day is on your own to explore Asheville and the estate.

Marbles and Glass (May 19 – 22)

While probably too far away for most of us, this weekend in Rhode Island is attractive. It includes mansion tours, ocean drive Corvette cruise, Fort Adams tour, 12 meter yacht charter, clam bake, shopping in Newport and much more.

Milford Proving Grounds (July 13 – 17)

This will be a short version of our club trip. While the agenda is not firm until later this month, in addition to the proving grounds, it should include the GM Heritage Center and possibly Pratt & Miller Racing, the Ford Museum, and of course, shopping.

One Lap of Kentucky (October 11-16, 18-22, or 25-29)

There are three dates to satisfy the demand for this tour because it is so popular.

2016 will be the 7th annual KY 1 Lap tour, part of the Mu-

seum in Motion (MiM) program and unique in that it is a partnership between the National Corvette Museum and the Kentucky State Police. The two organizations join together to raise money for both the Museum and Trooper Island, a KSP non-profit camp for underprivileged children. Each year the tour explores a different section of Kentucky. As always, the tour will be led by a Kentucky State Trooper, now using a marked red Corvette which is sure to attract attention as the caravan travels through an area of real Americana.

The agenda and registration should be active in June.

2016 Mid-America Road Trip

This year's big trip has a name! We are planning to leave Saturday, July 30th, and returning to DFW Wednesday, August 10th. In the interest of controlling space in the monthly newsletter, I plan to highlight a few of the trip's points of interest each month. For example, last month's newsletter highlighted the trip as a whole and the Road America Race Track.

The trip is continuing to come together and many folks are contributing great ideas; I am working out the rough trip routing and itinerary. For those just starting to hear about the trip, we will be heading north to Michigan and Wisconsin to the Road America racetrack located in Elkhart Lake, WI.

Although the Road America Race in Elkhart Lake, WI may be the ultimate destination of the trip, we plan to see a lot of cool things along the way:

- Indianapolis Motor Speedway Museum (located in the center of the race track)

<https://www.indianapolismotorspeedway.com>. There is a 60 to 90 minute grounds tour, including a narrated bus ride around the famed 2.5 mile track in one of the Speedway's comfortable tour buses. Who knows, maybe we can take our cars around the track for a parade lap and photo.



The Auto Racing Hall of Fame was established to perpetuate the names and memories of prominent personalities for their outstanding contributions to the sport of racing and to the development of the entire automotive industry.

The Museum's collection encompasses race cars from many series: IndyCar, NASCAR, Formula One, Sprint, Midget, motorcycle races, and drag racing. It also includes a variety of passenger automobiles, many of which were manufactured in Indiana by companies that once had ties to racing. These include spectacular examples of Duesenberg, Marmon, and Stutz marques, as well as Ferrari, Mercedes, and a variety of other European passenger car makers. The collection encompasses motorcycles, dragsters, cars and other vehicles that have set world land speed records at various points in history.

- Tour the General Motors Heritage Center

The GM North American Heritage Collection is made up of approximately 600 cars and trucks. Many reflect GM's industry firsts, like the first electric self-starter, used on the 1912 Cadillac, the first production V8 that powered the 1915 Cadillac, and the first air bag, found on 1974 Buick, Cadillac, and Oldsmobile models. Others are technological experiments like the first American gas turbine-powered car, Firebird 1, or the world's first hydrogen fuel cell-powered vehicle, the 1966 Electro-van. Concept cars and special-interest styling/performance one-offs are part of the mix, along with significant race cars and milestone production vehicles such as the first production 1966 Olds Toronado featuring General Motors' front-wheel drive.

- Tour Pratt & Miller (produces C7R racing engines)

Conceived, designed, constructed, developed, and campaigned by Pratt & Miller Engineering, the Corvette race cars that carry the banner of Corvette Racing have dominated Grand Touring racing in the U.S. and abroad. The close working relationship between Pratt & Miller, the production Corvette group, Chevrolet Racing, and GM Powertrain produced a performance icon that's recognized around the world.

- Visit a ginormous Christmas store

Bronner's Christmas Wonderland is the world's largest Christmas store and a Michigan retail institution. Established by local resident Wally Bronner in 1945, Bronner's Christmas Wonderland has grown into a three-hundred thousand square foot behemoth, boasting the largest and most diverse selection of Christmas paraphernalia on the planet. Upwards of two million shoppers visit the store annually.

And for those visitors who wish for a touch of real Christmas amidst the rampant commercialism, the Bronner's have adorned the property with a near-perfect replica of the Silent Night Chapel as it stands in faraway Salzburg, Austria

- Visit to Mackinac Island (no cars allowed)
- Hold our breath over the famous Mackinaw Bridge aka The Mighty Mac

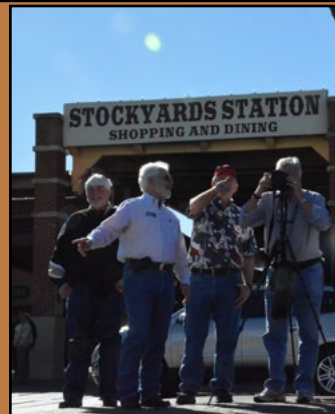
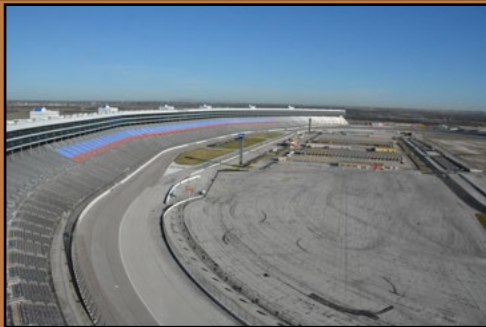


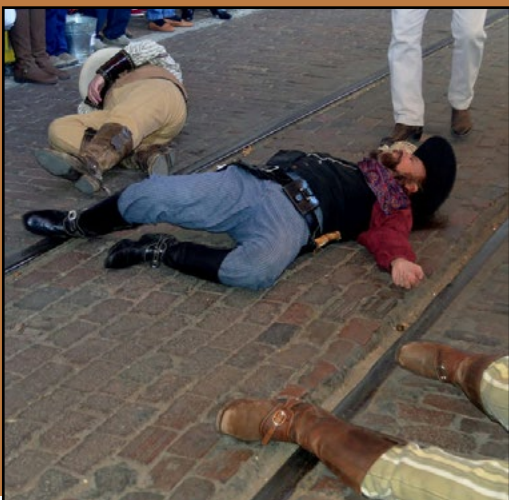

- Hand-made quilts



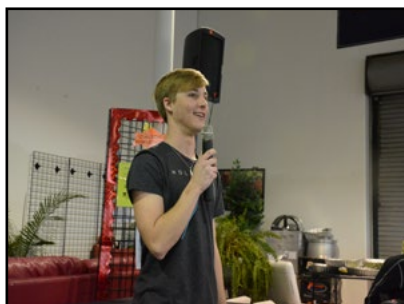
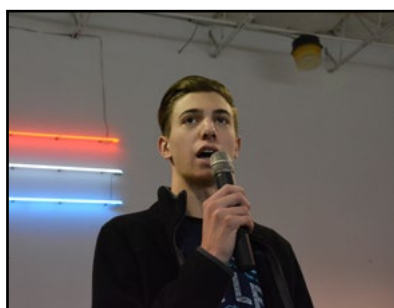
What you can do:

- When you're at a yard sale, garage sale or craft fair, pick up inexpensive items that can be grouped into gift baskets

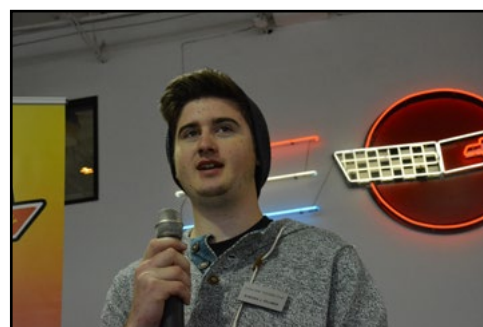
