Twelve years ago when we bought our first Corvette, I was one of those who believed that *it's just a car*. NCM Member Totals – Update #2

In July, I wrote about the number of LSCC members that also belong to the National Corvette Museum. I received a response to that article from LSCC member Foy Wilkey. Foy joined Lone Star in March of this year but has been a member of the NCM since 2014, which I appreciate very much by the way.

Of course, Foy was not on my list furnished by the NCM. So, I realized that if you were already members of the NCM when you joined Lone Star, you are not in my total. The exception would be if you updated your information with the NCM since you joined our club. If you think you might be in this category, please let me know. I can check my list and help you update your information with the NCM, if necessary.

I tried to recall the LSCC members that I know to have been involved with the Corvette Museum prior to joining our club. Several are not on my list and will be added. Among them are Kai and Kaci Spande. They joined Lone Star when Kai, the Corvette Plant Manager, was here for the Classic in May. In July, they upgraded their NCM membership to Lifetime. Also not on my list were Glenn and Andrea Johnson of Port Neches, Texas, and Lon and Anne Helton of Nashville, Tennessee.

The reason I mention these folks is that Kai, Glen and Lon are on the NCM Board of Directors with me. What makes this interesting is that this is most likely the first time ever one club had four members on the Board.

With the "missing" members I have found, the LSCC total number of members also in the NCM has grown from 303 to 313.

Members by State

Every so often, I request a spreadsheet of NCM membership by state to share with you. Florida leads the way with 3,391 members. Texas is second with 2,792. The only explanation for this is that a ton of people from the Northeast winter in Florida, and keep their cars there. I'll bet Texas is #1 in year round members.

The state with the least Corvettes is not really a state. It is District of Columbia with 8 cars.

More information will come as they post it. Watch our web site under Road Rally.



New Coordinators Needed!


It's time for you to get involved!

This year the Mecum Auction will be broadcast nationwide on NBC Sports Network. We will be in the same place we have been the past six years.



If you have never been on a LSCC caravan, I would like to reach out and invite you to a super fun trip this October. 


Proposed Amendment to Article XII - Board of Directors Job Descriptions



Final Corvette Rolls Off the Old Assembly Line as Retooling Begins



The final 2018 Corvette to be built on what we will now refer to as the Corvette factory's "old assembly line" was completed on Thursday afternoon. It was a 2018 Non-Z51 Corvette Stingray Coupe in Torch Red.

The dismantling of the assembly line began almost immediately after the Stingray was driven off the line.

Much of the existing assembly line process dates back to 1997 and the fifth generation Corvette, although some components go back to the founding of the former Chrysler air conditioning plant when it started building Corvettes in the early 1980s.

Over the next thirteen weeks, the old line will be dismantled and a new assembly line process utilizing flexible assembly methods will be put into place. For a really good primer on the changes coming to the Corvette assembly plant, watch our video of BGAP's general manager Kai Spande at the 2017 NCM Bash.

The assembly line will be rerouted to move the exterior panel assembly areas closer to the new paint shop, as well as moving the panel assembly towards the end of the line so as to lessen the potential for damage and increase build quality. Another aspect of the new assembly line once it restarts will be to slow it down, from 18 cars per hour to 12 cars so the workers will have a little more time per car to ensure quality.

A friend tells us that most plant employees will return to work around October 9th where they will begin training, however, new 2018 Corvettes will not start production until the end of October or first week in November.

We are also reminded that of the quality assurance (QA) process that the new Stingrays went through back in 2013 and we believe that once the plant starts production, there will be a series of extensive quality tests on the 2018 Corvettes that come off the new assembly line. That could mean the first 2018 Corvettes off the new line won't begin showing up to dealers until the end of November or early December.

The assembly line upgrades, along with the start-up and integration of the new paint facility, mark the beginning of some exciting times for Corvette owners. While much speculation revolves around the future of the Corvette, know that once the plant restarts later, the changes should further unlock the potential of the men and women who build our dream cars and the focus on quality will impact today's Corvette almost immediately.


