Sinkhole Update

The NCM board met on June 25 to make a decision concerning whether or not to cover the sinkhole. A decision was made – *sort of*. The *sort of* part means the final construction bid cannot exceed the cost estimate given to the Board. If it does, then it is back to square one.

The plan calls for a single level floor in the Skydome. A 20'x 40' opening will reveal the sinkhole and part of the cave. Two of the unrestorable cars will be placed in the hole. The key to the plan is the single level floor. It will allow space for as many or more cars to be displayed as before the cave-in, while still accommodating the opening. Stay tuned.

Now that the dust is settling on this year's Classic, I'm starting to get the ducks in a row for the November 8th HPDE track day at Eagles Canyon Raceway. I'm looking at changing the program just a little to get more people out on the track for the first time by introducing a Touring Group (pending insurance and track management approvals). We will still have the usual three run groups, plus in-car instructors and classroom instruction between run groups. Stay tuned, registration will be open in a couple of months.

Some of you track hounds already know about Texas World Speedway closing next year. For me, this is a big loss. TWS is my favorite track within a few hours of home that can still be run without breaking the bank. If you have ever wanted to drive this historic track, time is running out. If we have enough interest (15 cars or more), I will put a group together to piggyback a TDE event like we did at MSR. Please con-

tact me during the next month if you are interested.

Autocross is going smoothly. We still have plenty of room for more people, so come to Brookhaven College and give it a try. This is a great venue to learn basic car handling at low speeds in a "No Pressure" atmosphere. Drag Racing: It's all about who can run the most consistent times without "breaking out". Once you have established how fast ("ET" or Elapsed Time) your car is, then you post a "Dial-in time". The difference between your dial-in time and your competitor's in the opposite lane will equate to the offset in the start or green lights. In other words, if I dial-in at 11 seconds flat and my competitors dial-in is 11.10, he will get a .10 second head start. BUT, we are both subject to staying within our dial-in times (+ or -), otherwise it's called a "Break Out" and you lose. We race everything from trucks to sedans. You do not have to race your Corvette. Next chance to smoke a little rubber will be on September 7th.

Car Shows: We have tons this summer. Check out the Club Event Calendar for more info. My favorite weekly Corvette gathering, for those of us on the Westside, is at Rose's Café located at 2200 Precinct Line Road, Hurst, TX 76054. We meet at 7:00 pm every Wednesday night.
