Sinkhole - The End

Sunday, November 9th, was the last day to view the sink-hole. On Monday, the 10th, the Skydome was closed and construction began to repair the hole and skydome.

While the sinkhole is gone, it is not forgotten. Here are some amazing statistics from the time the sinkhole ap-

peared through September, *excluding* the 20th Caravan Anniversary dates of August 26th–31th.

These numbers are versus 2013:

Total number of visitors for 2014 is projected to be 230,000. The previous high was 200,900 in the 5th anniversary year of 1999. While some of the 2014 increases can be attributed to the C7 and the huge number of museum deliveries, there is no doubt that the sinkhole is the major reason for the astounding numbers.

The construction and repairs in the Skydome are estimated to take approximately six months to complete.

NCM Umbrella Policy

At the request of several customers, NCM insurance has secured a great source for personal umbrella policies.

A personal umbrella policy (PUP) is a type of insurance that provides liability coverage over and above your automobile or homeowner's policy. So, if your liability coverage isn't enough to cover the damages of an accident you cause or an incident on your property, a personal umbrella policy kicks in right where your other liability underlying limits have been reached. An umbrella policy can protect you when your automobile or homeowner's insurance isn't enough.

As an example: If an automobile policy liability limit is \$250,000, a \$1 million PUP would pick up at \$250,000 and give additional coverage to \$1 million.


