This month's meeting is at Mom's on Main in Aubrey on July 11, a short but nice road trip. Hopefully the waters will have subsided by then. Steve Haven, the owner, leads a project that LSCC should consider supporting. He provides refurbished bicycles to deserving boys and girls in the area. We'll have Steve explain the project more during the meeting. I'd like to propose that LSCC make a club contribution and individuals make a donation.

We just returned from a bucket list trip where we joined a tour going from the coast of Normandy to the bridges at Nijmegan and Arnhem to Bastogne (Battle of the Bulge) and to Munich. From Munich we toured Hitler's Eagles Nest and Dachau. We were on Utah and Omaha Beaches on June 5 and 6. Americans are still well remembered. Restored jeeps and trucks were everywhere. People were dressed in military uniforms. Impressive is an understatement. In our group was a WWII veteran, Val, who was in the 11th Armored Division, which landed at Normandy 4-6 weeks after the invasion. He was a participant in the Battle of the Bulge. One of our stops in Bastogne was at a site called The Barrick's, a working post then and now. Val was presented a framed proclamation by the Belgian Army, signed a veteran's guest book and was warmly thanked by a group of school kids. Refreshing to see history remembered so well. We visited the National Cemeteries at Normandy and Bastogne where General Patton is buried. I learned there were more casualties in the Battle of the Bulge than in the Normandy invasion and that no president has ever visited there.

What does this have to do with Corvettes, nothing, just a reflection as we are celebrating our youthful independence. However, I did spot several Corvettes on the road including a '67 427. While going to our hotel in Nijmegan, we spotted a shop with '58 and '63 split window Corvettes on display. The '63 had a red white and blue ribbon above the gas cap to create a medal. See pictures on pages 3 and 5.

Our last night was spent in Munich where their 858<sup>th</sup> anniversary was being celebrated. Bells chimed and beer flowed. We soaked the sights and sounds in a biergarten.



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
