The National Corvette Museum held its annual Bash April 28th to April 30th. We have some interesting news from that event. Also, our NCM brick drive struck gold, so we want to thank the participants.

2017 Corvette Introduction

As has been the case for several years, Chevrolet chose the Bash for its first public display of the 2017 model year Corvettes. There was a lot to see – four new colors and the return of the Grand Sport model.

The Grand Sport was the big news, a Z06 without the supercharger. Starting with the Z06 wide body and frame, GM bolted on 19 and 20 inch tires (again same as Z06). Also standard are larger brakes than the Z51 and magnetic selective ride. Many of the Z06 options are available, even including the Z07 package.

The Grand Sport comes in coupe and convertible in all colors. The famous GS hash marks are optional – in your choice of six colors – and so too are full length body stripes. So you can order the new Admiral Blue with red hash marks and white body stripe to identically replicate the famous '96 Grand Sport.

2017 Colors

Corvette announced and displayed four new colors for 2017 at the Bash. They are –

It's hard to believe that after all the months of planning and untold hours from our dedicated volunteers that the 27th Lone Star Corvette Classic is in the history books.

We welcomed old friends who always support us and met many new people who attended their 1st Classic and are hopefully hooked on our annual event. We continue to draw participants from areas outside the TX/OK/AR/LA region; Arizona, New Mexico, Wisconsin, Iowa, Kansas, Missouri, Pennsylvania and Virginia in particular deserve mention this year.

We had over 421 registrations that involved over 700 participants. Our 1st Dinner & Drive-In Movie on "Big Hoss" at TMS was a hit with those who participated. The BBQ was good and thanks to the support of 11 of Denton County's finest we had a short and uneventful cruise in the countryside after dinner. The evening was perfect for an old fashion drive-in movie. Over 200 people signed up for the Sunday Track Day and enjoyed the opportunity to drive on the TMS Oval and the infield Road Course. Following the lunch break, Andy Pilgrim and Lou Gigliotti thoroughly entertained us, especially the 6 people who purchased the auction rides, with some real race driving on the road course.

The Saturday Car Show totaled 220+ cars in both Member & Non-Member Judged and Show N' Shine categories. Our Saturday Awards Dinner was well attended and everyone enjoyed our guest speaker - Andy Pilgrim from Black Swan Racing. We welcomed back Weldon Floyd, auctioneer extraordinaire, who tag teamed with Adam Boca from NCM Insurance for our Live Auction this year and along the way not only entertained us but also helped us raise almost \$12,500.00 for our charities at the Live Auction. While the final numbers are not in it appears we will have raised almost \$20,000.00 from both the Live & Silent Auctions, all for charity.

As one of only 11 club members to have ever served as Classic Officer over the 27 years of the Classic, I will admit that the job is very challenging at times, but in the end it is also a very rewarding experience. The challenge is to come up with a Classic program that is both entertaining as well as supportive of our goal to raise funds for our charities. The reward is to see all the participants enjoying themselves over the 3-day event and know that as a 100% volunteer team we put on the best event possible and raised some money in the process.

I accepted the position for 2015 and again this year fully aware of the responsibility and stewardship involved to maintain the annual Lone Star Corvette Classic as a premier event, not just a car show. Few if any other clubs have access to and the full support from a 1st Class NASCAR facility. We also enjoy a great relationship with Total Driving Experience that enables us to host the road course during our Track Day.

I wrap up my 2nd year with a bit of relief and sadness as it has been one of the most fulfilling experiences I have had in my lifetime. I appreciate the faith and trust that the membership bestowed on me with this position.

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

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

The rest of the drive to Bowling Green was uneventful over backroads we have traveled several times. After checking into our room, we were off to the NCM Bash.


































2016 NCM Bash/HPDE

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
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
